






Communications & Engagement Lessons Learned


- 1. You are already a model of best practices, but it is SO MUCH harder now
- 2. <u>No amount of communications</u> will ensure that no one is surprised by or unaware of a recent or prospective Council decision
- 3. <u>No amount of education</u> will ensure that everyone knows or understands the same information for any project or action
- 4. <u>No amount of engagement</u> will ensure that all divergent viewpoints can be heard, accommodated and/or differences resolved
- 5. Delays, continuances, re-hearings cost time, money, and rising frictions.
- 6. Few decisions are ever changed by late new information.


