



Attention! Pacifica Restaurants and Food Facilities:

On March 14, 2022, the Pacifica City Council adopted a Disposable Foodware Ordinance, prohibiting the use of non-compostable, disposable food service ware. This new regulation became enforced October 1, 2022.

The City Council adopted <u>additional</u> provisions which will require food facilities to provide <u>reusable foodware and utensils</u> <u>for dine - in customers</u>. Enforcement begins June 1, 2023.

Many entities that have a valid health permit with the County of San Mateo to provide prepared food and beverages to the public within Pacifica will be impacted by the new



regulation.



Disposable Foodware Ordinance

On March 14, 2022, the City of Pacifica, following the San Mateo County Model Ordinance passed a Disposable Foodware Ordinance, prohibiting the use of non-compostable, disposable food service ware, and provisions on disposable food service ware distribution. This new regulation began on October 1, 2022. Many entities that have a valid health permit with the County of San Mateo to provide prepared food and beverages to the public within Pacifica will be impacted by the new regulation.
