Free Business Consulting Available for Pacifica Small Businesses

Many Pacifica businesses are facing complex choices for how to meet their financing needs. Whether your business is expanding, pivoting, emerging from COVID, managing working capital, consolidating, modernizing, or relocating... chances are you need cash to help get you through the transition. Here is a quick check-list of items you may wish to explore:

- 1. Assess you current debt and overall financial position. What are your capital needs in the short- and mid-term? Are there opportunities to restructure existing debt?
- 2. Assess your current banking relationship & current accounts with your bank. Are you in a position to talk with your banker about future plans and jointly discuss options?
- 3. Assess your financial statements & check your credit score. Do they need to be updated? Even if you've had problems in the past, there are steps you can take now to improve your credit score and better position your business venture for financing.
- 4. Contact your SBA representative. The U.S. Small Business Administration offers several loan products that are specifically designed to address the needs of small businesses. To identify SBA lenders near you, visit: https://www.sba.gov/funding-programs/loans.
- 5. Explore alternative lending organizations. We urge caution & careful research when you consider any alternative lending organization! With that caveat, you may wish to look at organizations such as ICA Fund, Working Solutions CDFI, MarbleBridge or others.
- Speak with a financial advisor or business consultant first! Organizations like the Small Business Development Center (SBDC) of San Mateo County, the Renaissance Entrepreneur Center, and SCORE offer free consulting.

Stacy's Rise Project


The Stacy's Rise Project will provide \$25,000 grants to 10 small businesses with preference given to women founders in the food and beverage industry.

To be eligible, applicants must:

- Be a for-profit U.S.-based business selling a consumer packaged good (CPG)
- Have annualized sales of between \$25,000 and \$1M.

Other eligibility criteria include:

- Must be willing to participate in a virtual 16 week mentorship program
- Must not be part of an accelerator program at the time of participation

10k Grants: Restaurant Disaster Relief





Disasters are unpredictable — but critical support shouldn't be. The average small business loses \$3,000 every day they remain closed due to a natural disaster. To help restaurants recover in times of critical need, DoorDash has partnered with Hello Alice to create the Restaurant Disaster Relief Fund. The fund supports restaurants impacted by natural disasters like fires, floods, and hurricanes, and provides relief through \$10,000 grants.

California Competes Tax Credit (CCTC)

The California Competes Tax Credit (CCTC) is an income tax credit available to businesses that want to locate in California or stay and grow in California.

Businesses of any industry, size, or location compete for over \$180 million available in tax credits by applying in one of the three application periods each year.

For fiscal year 2023 - 2024, GO-Biz will accept applications for the California Competes Tax Credit during the following periods:

- Tuesday, January 2, 2024 Monday, January 22, 2024
- Monday, March 4, 2024 Monday, March 18, 2024

Start with Kindness

Welcome guests with a smile, make eye contact, and use personalized greetings to show your warmth and enthusiasm.



Recognize We Share Commonalities while Being Different

Avoid making age-related or other stereotypes by getting to know your customer and learning their preferences.



Step into their Shoes

Be aware off the unique needs of older adults and support them with patience, empathy, and respect.



Communicate Clearly

Speak at an appropriate volume level, lower background music or noise.



Promote Safety & Accessibility

Position products within arm's reach, use proper lighting, and keep entrances and pathways clear of trip and fall hazards.



Be Mindful of Memory Loss

If you recognize signs of dementia, such as short-term memory loss, confusion, wandering, and frustration, give simple instructions in a dignified way

Go the Extra Mile

To support the challenges that may come with age, offer a helping hand and provide good customer service in a courteous manner.

Make it Readable

Use large, easy-to-read text, position signage in reasonable locations and find alternate solutions for easier reading.



Keep a Watchful Eye

Stay alert and lookout for suspicious activity, and be an advocate for older adults who may be more vulnerable to fraud and abuse.




Celebrate our Elders
