RESOLUTION APPROVING \$75,000 IN GRANTS OF MEASURE K FUNDS TO SUPPORT CITY PARTICIPATION IN THE HOME FOR ALL COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PROGRAM, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$15,000 PER GRANT FOR BRISBANE, PACIFICA, SAN MATEO, FOSTER CITY, AND HILLSBOROUGH

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California,

WHEREAS, between 2010 and 2014, approximately 24 new jobs were created for every new housing unit added in San Mateo County; and

WHEREAS, in 2015, Supervisors Don Horsley and Warren Slocum convened the Closing the Job-Housing Gap Task Force to address the gap between new jobs and available housing, and the Task Force created the Home for All collaborative to implement housing initiatives; and

WHEREAS, due to increased housing creation, the jobs-housing gap dropped to 12 new jobs for every new housing unit for the period between 2010 and 2017; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, Home for All launched a pilot Community Engagement Program of intensive, housing-related community engagement activities, and each participating city (Burlingame, Half Moon Bay, Portola Valley, and Redwood City) received a grant of Measure K funds; and

WHEREAS, the results from the Community Engagement Program were overwhelmingly positive and included increased resident engagement, increased capability of cities and residents to discuss housing-related challenges and solutions, and a better-informed public; and

WHEREAS, in late 2018, Home for All invited cities to apply for a second year of the Community Engagement Program, and five cities were selected to participate and receive Measure K grants; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors approves an allocation of \$75,000 of Measure K funds to support city participation in the Home for All Community Engagement Program in the amount of \$15,000 per grant for Brisbane, Pacifica, San Mateo, Foster City, and Hillsborough.
