

**RESOLUTION NO. 19-2021**

**A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING COLLABORATION BETWEEN THE CITY, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, THE PACIFICA RESOURCE CENTER, AND OWNERS OF LARGE PROPERTIES IN OR NEAR PACIFICA TO EVALUATE THE FEASIBILITY OF A SAFE PARKING PROGRAM TO ASSIST THE UNHOUSED IN MOTORHOMES SEEKING TO BECOME HOUSED**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Pacifica has for many years held the Council Goal: "A Healthy and Compassionate Community", which is defined to include addressing affordable housing and mental health services, investigating strategies related to homelessness, and supporting youth services; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has worked collaboratively with the Pacifica Resource Center for many years to deliver services to the unhoused, and the City contributes more than \$80,000 annually to the Resource Center; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2020 the City Council directed the City Manager to begin pursuing whether the owner of the San Francisco RV Resort at 700 Palmetto Ave, Pacifica, CA 94044 might be interested in leasing or selling a portion of their property to be utilized as a safe parking program; and

**WHEREAS**, the County of San Mateo has stated goals related to programs and services for the unhoused;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Pacifica City Council encourages collaboration between the City, County of San Mateo, the Pacifica Resource Center, and owners of large properties in or near Pacifica to evaluate the feasibility of a safe parking program to assist the unhoused in motorhomes seeking to become housed.
